Executive Summary

On April 20 - 21, 2021, the Peace and Justice Institute at Valencia College, along with the Early Learning Coalition of Orange County and title sponsor Orlando Health, hosted the third annual (virtual) [Creating a Resilient Community: From Trauma to Healing Conference](#) to continue the conversation, collaboration, and education around Positive & Adverse Childhood experiences (PACEs), trauma informed practices, and community resilience.

In order to continue our commitment to safety and health amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2-day conference was again offered on a virtual platform. This year, in order to improve participant engagement, interaction, and networking capabilities, we selected an innovative platform called Hopin for the 2021 conference experience.

Of the 358 that registered, 338 individuals from 9 sectors and 162 organizations and agencies participated in the live, 2-day event on Hopin. Of the 338 attendees, 42.6% had attended at least one of our previous conferences and 14.2% of attendees attended three years in a row.

What set this year apart were the sheer number of community presenters who offered their time and expertise. **70 community leaders** volunteered to serve as workshop presenters, moderators, and/or panelists throughout the 2-day conference. This level of engagement demonstrated the power of the community network that has been nurtured over the last three years, and how we are poised for continued forward momentum and collaboration for measurable change.

The vision of this year's conference was two fold:

1. **Day One Vision:** To go beyond our initial foundational learning about Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and make deeper connections to neuroscience, immunology and positive childhood experiences and their relationship to community and individual wellness.
2. **Day Two Vision:** To curate and elevate local practitioners and leaders currently implementing emerging and best practices around PACEs, resilience, and Trauma Informed Care in our community.

Conference Day One - April 20, 2021:

On day one of the conference, we were able to learn from an award-winning science journalist, author of six books, and an internationally-recognized speaker, [Donna Jackson Nakazawa](#) through her Keynote presentation titled: "A New View of the Brain: Trauma, ACEs, and Flourishing." Directly following her morning presentation, Ms. Jackson Nakazawa went on to offer an additional afternoon workshop, "Your Healing Narrative: Write-to-Heal With Neural Re-Narrating for Individuals and Healing Professionals" which used science-based writing-to-heel and mindfulness techniques to

help participants recognize and override the brain's old thought patterns and create new, transformative healing narratives to promote flourishing. Additional day one workshop offerings included presentations on "Protective and Promotive Factors," "Service Navigation Across Child-Serving Systems", "Epigenetics, PACEs, and Salutogenesis," and "Promoting Resilience Across the Lifespan."

Conference Day Two - April 21, 2021:

On day two of the conference, participants started out the day with pledges of continued support from key leaders in our community including City of Orlando Mayor Buddy Dyer and Orange County Sheriff John Mina.

Following the opening remarks, participants could select to attend two of ten "Emerging and Best Practices Workshops" offered and moderated by community professionals. These engaging, 45-minute sessions highlighted the most innovative work happening around Positive and Adverse Childhood Experiences (PACEs) and Trauma Informed Care in our community.

The day concluded with back-to-back panels where community leaders shared their experience and vision for a more trauma-informed, resilient community:

Panel 1: "Shifting from "What is Wrong with You?" to "What Happened to You?" moderated by board certified pediatrician Dr. Candice Jones. Panelists included: Seminole County Sheriff Dennis Lemma, Orange County Mayor Jerry Demings, School District of Osceola County Deputy Superintendent Thomas Phelps, and Orlando Health's Teen Xpress Medical Director Dr. Adaobi Okobi.

Panel 2: "Our Collective Impact: Regional Resilience Networks" moderated by Peace and Justice Institute Director Rachel Allen. Panelists included: Valencia School of Public Safety Executive Dean Dr. Jeff Goltz, Central Florida Foundation Vice President of Community Strategies and Initiatives Sandi Vidal, Seminole County Florida Department of Health Office of Health Promotion and Education Venise White.

The Participant Experience:

In addition to the speakers, conference participants engaged in mindfulness practices, heard local musical performances, and received relevant community resources and specific ways to engage with this work around trauma healing and resilience in Central Florida.

As one would hope with the continued education and community engagement around this work over the years, the majority of conference participants who took the conference survey entered the conference with above average knowledge about ACEs, Trauma Informed Care, Resilience Strategies. By design, our conference created a

learning experience on par with what participants were hoping for, with **100% of participants who took the post-survey indicating that the conference met their expectations**. Additionally, many of the survey narrative reflections indicated that participant expectations were not only met, but exceeded or surpassed:

“I am blown away...”

“The conference actually surpassed my expectations.”

“The conference was amazing!”

Moving Forward Together

What started in 2019 as just an idea for a local conference to raise awareness about Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) in Central Florida, has grown into a multi-sector collective impact movement actively building a trauma-informed, resilient community.

Creating a Resilient Community (CRC) Network

Strategic planning meetings have been held every other month since the first conference in 2019. The group, now known as the Creating a Resilient Community (CRC) Network, has grown to 296 individuals representing 156 different organizations and agencies. The network’s mission is to *“collaborate across sectors and communities to transform our region into one of prevention, hope, healing, and resilience for all.”*

Training: “Why Positive & Adverse Childhood Experiences (PACEs) Matter”

Based on the relationships developed through the conferences and the growing CRC Network, a 2-hour, introductory workshop titled “Why Positive and Adverse Childhood Experiences (PACEs) Matter” was born. This workshop is already being offered in the community and selected facilitators within the CRC Network have been trained to roll this educational experience out intentionally and broadly within Central Florida.

Community Common Read Initiative

PJI has a Community Common Read Initiative focused on books addressing Positive and Adverse Childhood Experiences (PACEs), trauma healing, and resilience. The group has grown to now have 264 members and we have read the following books as a community:

- 2019: *The Deepest Well* by Dr. Nadine Burke Harris
- 2020: *Building Resilience in Children and Teens* by Dr. Kenneth Ginsburg
- 2021: *Childhood Disrupted* by Donna Jackson Nakazawa

In partnership with the generous support of Valencia’s courier services, PJI was able to give away nearly 400 free books since 2020 to promote this community-wide initiative.

Beyond the learning and discussion that happens on the online platform, PJI hosts multiple virtual, live sessions for each book to create opportunities for further dialogue and connection.

Management and Expansion of ACEs Connection Central Florida

ACEs Connection Central Florida is an online space for community members, professionals, and leaders to collaborate across sectors in a movement to prevent Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), heal from trauma, and build resilience in Central Florida. PJI is a community manager of this online community, posting content, articles, and events as well as inputting shared ACEs data into a tracking system to broaden our impact and measure our collective community impact.

The past three *Creating a Resilient Community: From Trauma to Healing* Conferences have laid the foundation for what is now a critical moment of potential. A strong network of relationships have been built across sectors, a base understanding of PACEs, resilience, and trauma-informed practices has been established, workshops have been developed, trainers have been trained, a community-wide vision has been cast, and now we are ready to move into action.

We are seeking a committed partner to invest in the community's forward momentum and elevate the impact of the collective efforts to "transform our region into one of prevention, hope, healing, and resilience for all."

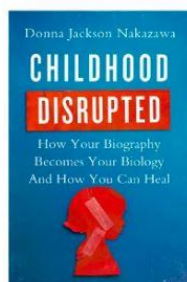
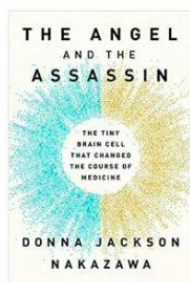


Donna is an award-winning science journalist, author of six books, and an internationally-recognized speaker whose work explores the intersection of neuroscience, immunology, and human emotion.
